The listed rates include standard husbandry practices. Rates for projects requiring additional services (e.g., BSL-2 & BSL-3 containment, barrier housing, GLP, etc.) may differ significantly and consultation with Animal Resources is recommended to establish a budget. Rates are subject to review & revision in January and July of each year. For pastured animals receiving feed and/or hay, refer to the Services Fee Schedule. Per diem is defined as the expenses required to maintain an animal or box of animals (mice) for any portion of a calendar day.

ANIMAL PROCUREMENT

DOGS (RANDOM SOURCE)

Dogs procured from random sources are distinguished by the level of quarantine that they receive. The Animal Welfare Act requires that dogs must be held for five (5) days. Ordering random source dogs should be completed well in advance to ensure the best chance of filling an animal order. The ability to fill an order depends entirely on the availability of dogs from municipal pounds. The Animal Resources Unit does not maintain a stock supply of random source dogs. These facts, coupled with holding and quarantine times, require proper planning and advance ordering. In particular, very specific orders (weight, sex, age, breed) can be quite difficult to fill in a timely manner. As a rule of thumb, unless prior arrangements are made, please allow 45 calendar days for orders of 1-15 dogs, 75 calendar days for 16-30 dogs, and 105 calendar days for 31 or more dogs. Random source dogs start incurring per diem charges upon arrival at our facilities.

Class I - Upon arrival at Animal Resources quarantine facilities, Class I dogs are identified, receive a general physical examination, temperament evaluation, and are vaccinated with DHLPIV vaccine for distemper, hepatitis, leptosprosis, parvo influenza, canine parvo, and rabies vaccines. Additionally dogs are treated for endoparasites and ectoparasites. Class I dogs are quarantined for a minimum of five (5) days. Users will be notified as soon as animals arrive. After the five day holding period and subsequent transfer to research project, dogs must be used within forty-eight (48) hours unless prior arrangements are made. Class I dogs are intended for terminal projects.

Class II - Upon arrival dogs are identified, vaccinated, and processed the same as Class I dogs except they are held at Animal Resources quarantine facilities for a minimum of fourteen (14) days and at the end of this period receive a second round of vaccinations.

HOOFSTOCK

All hoofstock animals are required to undergo a minimum seven (7) day quarantine and acclimation period per Animal Resources standard operating procedures. All animals are identified and receive a general physical examination. Vaccinations and parasite treatments given to these animals are dependent upon species, source, and history of each animal and follow Animal Resources standard operating procedures. Users are required to pay for all per diem costs incurred during the quarantine and acclimation period. A minimum of thirty-five (35) calendar days is required for all hoofstock animal orders, unless prior arrangements are made with Animal Resources. Hoofstock are purchased based on market price or negotiated price from suppliers.

- F** Resident Animal Resources animals, if available, may be used ONLY for non-invasive procedures under an IACUC approved Animal Use Protocol and then returned to Animal Resources.
- G** Charges apply for all animal order changes or each transfer event. Transfer events are: (1) Transferring animals to another Principle Investigator, (2) Transferring animals to another Animal Use Protocol, (3) Transferring animals to another account.
- H** Convenience fee is a charge for services or other activities which must be executed within twenty-four (24) hours of the initial approved and confirmed service request. Requester must complete Services Request Form.
